What is Parent Commissioning?

"Behold, children are a heritage from the Lord,
the fruit of the womb a reward.

Like arrows in the hand of a warrior are the children of one's youth.

Blessed is the man who fills his quiver with them!"

Psalm 127:3-5 ESV

A new child has entered your life! What a joyful and exciting time! You also are now faced with new feelings, decisions, and challenges as you begin your journey of parenting this precious gift. Yes, you are holding a beautiful gift from God. You want the best for this child. You want to "do it right". For this reason, you are participating in Parent Commissioning at Restoration Church.

Parent Commissioning is made of several important ingredients. First is the recognition that the child you hold is not yours, but God's. God is the author of life. Your baby is not an accident, mistake or even the outcome of your choice. The baby you hold today is a miracle of God's creative power. This life, with all its uniqueness and potential, is a gift that God has given to you.



Pass On Your Faith

When Paul wrote these words to Timothy, he clearly communicated a godly grandmother and mother passing down their faith to Timothy. Why don't we baptize babies?

We believe that the Bible has much to say about the practice of baptism. At Restoration Church of Sanford, we take baptism seriously because we believe that God takes baptism seriously. It is our goal to practice baptism the way that the New Testa-ment prescribes. Baptism is one of two ordinances (the other being the Lord's Supper) given to the church by the Lord Jesus Christ.

Baptism is for believers - those who have put their faith and trust in the Lord Jesus Christ. Baptism is only seen in the Bible when someone receives Christ and confesses Him as Savior and Lord. Baptism pictures the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ, symbolizing life before Christ and a new life in Him. While the intent of infant baptism is to identify a child with the Christian faith, baptism cannot secure salvation. Each child must hear and respond to the gospel of Jesus Christ.

For this reason, we have a Parent Commissioning service. We do not want to confuse this service with baptism which follows a profession of faith.

Are we required to be covenant members of Restoration Church to participate?

Yes. Participants must be members of our church body because we are asking our church family to make a commitment to embrace and support your family. That can only be accomplished if you are fully involved in the ministries of our church.

Can we include godparents as a part of Parent Commissioning?

No. Once again, this is not infant baptism, rather it is a recognition of the gift God has provided. The practice of choosing godparents comes out of history and church tradition and is not found in Scripture. We do, however, encour-age every family to select prayer partners who will stand along with the church members and commit to supporting the parents in prayer during the child-raising years.

Can unmarried biological parents participate in Parent Commissioning?

No. While we honor the life of each child and encourage parents, married and unmarried, to embrace the importance of spiritual commitment for children, parent commissioning is intended to reflect the teaching of Scripture on family life. Understanding the sacred honor of marriage as presented in God's Word, we believe every public act of worship is to conform to His standards. To fail to recognize and honor the specific teaching of Scripture on matters of family life would violate the integrity of our church and the Savior we serve. For those who are unmarried or living together, taking steps to acknowledge and surrender to God's design for their individual lives would take precedence over participation in parent commissioning. Our goal in ministry is to meet people where they are in life, lead them to God's grace and truth, and help them discover and pursue God's design for their lives.

How do I sign up for Parent Commissioning?
